Order Additional Stoma Supplies If you are using more products than usual for some reason, you need to be reviewed by your STN (or GP) to find the cause and ensure the correct products are being used. They will be able to complete an application form for additional supplies. Refurbishments

The positive feedback continues to be received and we are planning new lighting in the warehouse for the first time in a while.

Postage

Members continue to take advantage of the reduced cost of postage (\$10) from April 1st but it is likely to be increased to \$12 in January 2025.

Your ordering

"Order what you need – and use what you order" remains our request. We still need that 2 weeks' notice for your order. Don't be anxiously awaiting your next delivery, but neither have more than a month's supply in reserve. Protection of the excellent and unigue Australian system is everyone's business, so please check your storage area before ordering each time.

WAOA AGM

This is to be conducted on Saturday 30th November. Membership fees may need to be increased for the 2025/6 year - more data available shortly. This projection is mainly due to the increased costs related to IT - functionality, security and the EXCITING slow introduction of a Member Portal for improved ordering.

Raising awareness of living with a stoma

This is one of the areas highlighted in the survey and WAOA staff and volunteers have already been active in multiple places – and this continues.

- Airport screening appears to have improved and we are still working with the Perth team
- Education has been presented to GP Registrars and final year UWA medical students
- Ageing Well Expo in August
- Seniors and Carers Expo in Rockingham in October
- Tania and I attended the WA Rural Health Conference held in March to help support health practitioners in our farflung state, as we know that a significant number (likely more than a quarter of our 4,000+ members) live rurally or remotely
- WAOA hosted 10 third year Curtin medical students for 4 days "clinical experience" very positive feedback
 received as to the benefits they perceived in attending. Thank you to those who came especially to meet and talk
 to these future doctors
- A number of ostomates answered Curtin's Medical School call for patients and simulated patients would love to have your feedback please
- 65 Stomal Therapy Nursing students are enrolled this year in the course at Curtin, including 10 rural WA nurses and 22 interstate nurses

Mini-doll character Sara is joining her friends at a waterpark with her ostomy bag out and proud, a wry smile on her face, but showing that ostomates can still enjoy their life after ostomy surgery.

Sara has an obvious midline incision printed on her abdomen, with an ostomy bag high on her right-hand side – likely to be an ileostomy or urostomy. On the box and in the promotional materials she is seen enjoying her day at the waterpark by going on the waterslides and sunbathing by the pool, activities that are often a nervous experience for new ostomates.

Many Lego Friends TM characters carry over into the Lego Friends TV series and seasonal movies – hopefully we can see Sara appear in these too.

It is our hope that having this set come out with little fanfare is just one step towards more ostomate representation in the toy market. We cannot wait to share her with new paediatric patients as they come through our office, and to use her as an educational tool for ostomates with young families.

Sara is only available in the 814 piece, Heartlake City Water Park set (number 42630) with a RRP of \$129.99.



What is Rectal Irrigation?

Gufora[®] have a range of both low and high-volume products to meet the individual needs of patients

Certain conditions respond well to low volume rectal irrigation and others to high volume irrigation.

Rectal irrigation, also known as transanal or anal irrigation, is a treatment to manage bowel symptoms.

Rectal irrigation is a simple and hygienic solution for effectively managing symptoms of chronic constipation and / or faecal incontinence¹. Rectal irrigation is usually self-administered (or by a carer or another healthcare professional), sitting on the toilet or commode.

You'll need to be assessed by your healthcare professional for suitability to use rectal irrigation. They'll determine your symptoms and individual situation. If you are eligible, you will be taught how to instil warm tap water into the bowel via the anus. This is undertaken using either a cone or catheter, attached to a water reservoir (either a bag or soft pump). When the cone or catheter is removed, the water is expelled along with the contents of the bowel.

Advantages of rectal irrigation

- Can help to achieve bowel continence
- Reduces time spent on bowel management
- May reduce the risk of urinary tract infection
- May reduce the use of and need for laxatives and anti-diarrhoeals



Albany Support Group Update...

Highlights from Albany Ostomy Support Group Meeting - held on 8th March 2024.

The President Gerry van der Wal opened the meeting in the Albany Free Reformed Church at 1:30 pm and welcomed all present. There were 10 members present with 2 spouses attending as well. We were thankful that our STN, Rachael van den Hoek was also able to grace us with her presence. A receipt for the amount of \$100, being our donation to the Albany Hospice was tabled, as well as notification of the transfer of \$50 to the Albany Free Reformed Church for the use of their building.

Experiences were shared and support was given, particularly by our STN which was much appreciated. Particular attention was paid to experiences whilst travelling overseas as it seems that not all airline staff are sufficiently informed on how to deal with ostomates and their needs. Overall, however, it appeared that there was sufficient understanding to ensure that overseas holidays were not marred by unpleasant experiences due to potential ostomy stumbling blocks.

The meeting donated the sum of \$27.85 to the kitty, bringing this up to a current total of \$57.50. Coffee and cake and socialising was enjoyed by all afterwards for another relaxing and enjoyable meeting.

Highlights from Albany Ostomy Support Group Meeting - held on 7th June 2024.

The President, Gerry van der Wal, opened the meeting in the Albany Free Reformed Church at 1:30 pm and welcomed all present. There were again 10 members present with 2 spouses attending as well, and we again welcomed our STN, Rachael.

One of our members shared with us that he will be losing his ostomy status as he needs to have both his kidneys removed as they have become affected by cancer. This will result in him requiring regular hook ups with a dialysis machine. We wished him well for his coming operation and subsequent treatment and assured him that he would always be welcome in our midst despite losing his ostomy bag.

During the ensuing discussion, it became evident that whilst private health care may ensure that one is treated sooner, the out of cost expenses make it of doubtful whether this is a viable option to consider from a financially prudent perspective, particularly for country patients where the local hospital is invariably a public hospital.

We also received an interesting description of the procedure involved in "Irrigation", including its advantages and disadvantages. According to the member, he considers a colostomates using the irrigation method was far preferable to being a urostomates, although this was challenged by the urostomates present. We then had a discussion on the correct usage of overnight bags, with some members preferring not to use this due to getting tangled up in the tubing, whilst other members claiming it enabled them to have a restful, unbroken sleep all night long.

Our STN then gave us a presentation on the use and advantages of support belts, particularly where hernias were present, to provide support to the affected areas and potentially prevent further protrusion of the hernia. Her presentation was much appreciated, and we hope she will be able to see her way clear to make this a regular feature of our meetings.

The meeting donated the sum of \$27.85 to the kitty, bringing this up to a current total of \$57.50. Coffee and cake and socialising was enjoyed by all afterwards for another relaxing and enjoyable meeting. Our next meeting is scheduled for the **6th of September**, same time same place.

The clinic is being fully utilised over the 5 days with both ostomates and staff making full use of our time. Catherine has also been on a 5-week wound care course which will further enhance her portfolio. Thank you to Deb Day, Deb Courney and Nicole Denker for covering the clinic in our absences.

Medical Students and Stomal Therapy Nurse Students

Thank you to those who volunteered to make both our Medical and STN students welcome during their visits. Overall, we had 10 medical students spend 4 days with us and their feedback has been extremely positive. They were very grateful to everyone for taking time out to meet with them. The students had to present their experiences to the rest of their year on return to Curtin University, so we will have a cohort of very well-informed upcoming Drs in ostomy care.

This year saw an unprecedented number of nurses enrol in the 1 year post graduate STN course which has been subsidised by the government with **64** nurses enrolled from around the country and 46 of those from WA. Thank you again to those have volunteered to meet with them and allow their participation in the STN clinic.

Thank You Perth Airport

Our support groups are continuing to grow momentum and expand across the country and in light of this we are very grateful recipients of Perth Airports' community partnership grant. We were awarded \$1,100 which we are going to put towards speakers, catering and where applicable hire costs of the venues for our support groups. Last month we had a record number of ostomates (50+) attend our support group meeting that was presented by the customer service team from Perth Airport. Their talk was very well received, and everyone was very appreciative of the hard work that the team has been doing to improve the experiences of ostomates moving through security.

Bowel & Stoma Health WA News

Exmouth/Carnarvon/Geraldton

In the second week of May I travelled to Geraldton, Carnarvon and Exmouth which proved to be another very worthwhile and productive trip.

In Geraldton I met with both the STNs Lina Gedero (Geraldton Regional) and Kristina Murray (Silver Chain). Lina and I ran a joint education session for a couple of staff at the Regional and I ran an evening session for GPs/practice nurses/allied health. I was able to meet with Rhonda who does such a great job with the local support group and Dr Stephanie Milns Sizer at Geraldton University. Dr Milns Sizer has invited me back next year to run a full day education session for her student nurses in stoma care which is fantastic as their current course provides very little.



I headed on to Carnarvon and Exmouth (hospital pictured to the left) where I ran STN clinics and provided education to the hospital ward staff. A total of 7 ostomates were seen and stoma care education was provided to 22 health care professionals.

By the time you read this I will have been to **Narrogin 6th/7th June** to run a STN clinic, attend the quarterly support group and provide three separate education sessions to hospital staff, residential care staff and allied health. I am very excited to meet with Emma Howard who is undertaking the STN course this year which means

Narrogin will have on-site support. In addition, we have discovered another STN at Katanning Hospital, Chianne Cole.

The week of the **10th of June I will have travelled to Broome, Derby and Fitzroy Crossing** again running STN clinics in both Broome and Derby in addition to providing education sessions to both hospital staff and at the Aboriginal Health Centres. I will have travelled to the residential care facility in Fitzroy Crossing to review the ostomates there and provide education to carers.

Extracurricular activities

In addition to the rural visits, I will have travelled to Adelaide in mid-June to present to other STN colleagues on preventing peristomal skin complications and run a Perth session in July alongside the wonderful Professor Keryln Carville.

Mid-June, I was invited to speak at the clinical leadership group for Aboriginal Health Medical Services which is a fantastic opportunity to increase awareness of ostomies and the services that we offer here at WAOA.

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Results of the recent WAOA Membership Survey


Age groups

Thank you to all who participated in this survey and provided a snapshot of a number of aspects important to the Management Committee, Staff and Volunteers. We want to give the best service we can.


Demographics

The survey was taken by 655 members, which equals about 15% of our total member base.

Age and residence groups of surveyed compared to total members appear comparable.









The time people have been Ostomates, and the type of Ostomy also seem comparable with our total member base, however Permanent Ostomates are slightly overrepresented in the survey.

Skin Health

- A. Unsurprisingly, 39% of the Ostomates who took the survey reported skin issues
- B. Only 60% of the Ostomates who took the survey had had their recommended review
- C. We are pleased to see that the majority of Ostomates only have the occasional leakage



ACTION by WAOA:

- 1. Periodically remind you to check on your skin health
- 2. Develop a guide on the intended use of accessories

Educational Outcomes


- A. More than half are satisfied with the level of information they received prior to surgery, but about ¼ would have liked more information from their STN or surgeon
- B. Most Ostomates did not know what a stoma was before they became an Ostomate themselves. Those that did, knew mostly because they had a family member or friend that is an Ostomate, others through their work or education and a small number through general knowledge

ACTION by WAOA:

- 1. Share this data with STNs. & distribute leaflets for medical staff to provide information on our services
- 2. Advertise the offer of contact with an Ostomate to anyone being advised to have a stoma

Quality of Life


More Ostomates that took the survey feel that their quality of life (QOL) has decreased.

Suggestions for future meetings were plentiful:



ACTION by WAOA:

- 1. Each group seems to have different needs so will continue to support as requested
- 2. Continue to offer support meetings throughout the year with different activities
- 3. Continue to hold information sessions on different topics
- 4. Invest in technology to make sessions accessible via zoom or video via WAOA website
- 5. Support requests to set up more regional support groups eg South of the river, Broome, Dunsborough and Busselton



Support


- A. 30% of Ostomates who have taken the survey are interested in obtaining professional psychological support through WAOA. This number increases in the younger Ostomate group, the Ostomates with an 'Other' stoma (not a colostomy, ileostomy or urostomy), as well as in the group that answered the question regarding QOL with a lower score. Many mention that this would have been useful at some point in their journey.
- B. Ostomates who took the survey overwhelmingly stated that they believe it would benefit Ostomates if the general public could know more about life with a stoma. They believe it would reduce the stigma and would help, for example, in regard to experiences at the airport or at disabled toilets.

ACTION by WAOA:

- 1. Explore options to provide access to an affordable service, knowledgeable in the issues faced by Ostomates, rather than only a regular counsellor or psychologist
- 2. Continue to raise awareness at events eg 'Ostomy Awareness Day', 'Aging Well Expo'
- 3. Using WAOA's side building windows to advertise people of all ages with a stoma living fulfilling lives
- 4. Other promotional ideas like Bunnings sausage sizzle
- 5. Increased social media presence
- 6. Explore ways of raising awareness in hospital staff, gyms, carers, other disability groups
- 7. Explore ways that contribute to making the disabled toilet situation better (signage of a wheelchair and person with a pouch!?)


WAOA Services

- A. Over 90% of the Ostomates who took the survey stated that they are satisfied with the WAOA opening hours
- B. Communication channels also seem to be very individual with a focus on email
- C. General feedback on our website was good
- D. Over 70% Ostomates who took the survey stated mostly that they like the Newsletter





- E. Most Ostomates who took the survey have no trouble placing their orders
- F. Over 90% of Ostomates who took the survey do check their stock levels prior to placing an order
- G. Most Ostomates who took the survey keep between 2 - 4 weeks' worth of back-up supply on hand. Younger Ostomates, Ostomates in remote areas and urostomates seem to keep less
- H. Most Ostomates who took the survey don't seem to get anxious about running out of supplies



ACTION by WAOA:

- 1. Make information on current Management Committee members available on website
- 2. Increase the information on any information sessions we hold
- 3. Publish a current price list for cash sale items held by WAOA. *See end of this article for the list
- 4. Share more articles on our social media platforms
- 5. Help organise events for younger Ostomates

ACTION underway by WAOA - Members Portal

We are pleased to announce that we are in the process of introducing a Member Portal where each member can create an account to have access to their ordering and credit history, upload documents, update contact details, make easy payments and track your order, have more detailed advice on any change made to your order. We are hoping to start a soft launch sometime later this year, but please allow another 12 months for this to be fully operational. Please note: this will not satisfy the requests for online shopping, it won't have photos nor access to information on items not previously ordered. You will still be able to post or drop off your order.

<u>Fun Fact</u>: About half the products available on the scheme have <u>never been requested</u> by any of our members!

General Comments on Stock Supplies

- Managing your back-up stock is tricky at the beginning, as things are still changing, and you might have to go to a different pouch. During this time, we ask you to please order conservatively
- We ask you to keep about a month worth of supplies and allow 14 days for your supplies to be ready when you place an order
- Of the 3,430 different products available on the Stoma Appliance Scheme only about 10% are commonly
 used products that we aim to always have on hand and can therefore get your order ready soon after you
 have placed it. Products used by only a few members will be ordered from the supplier only once we have
 received your order. Those products will then come from the eastern states by road or rail and take 5 10
 days to arrive
- Please don't leave yourself short, always expecting your product to be available immediately
- Any product can also happen to be unavailable (on back order from suppliers) at times
- In case you were not aware, once you have had your stoma more than 6 months and have used the same product for a while, we can supply a double allowance at once. This saves time, hassles and postage
- Usage is very different between members: some members only order twice a year
- The scheme is designed to provide you with all the products YOU NEED. If this is more than average, it might be time you had a STN review

Reducing Wastage of products and packaging	 Thank you for your detailed feedback on how Ostomates themselves can help to keep product wastage at a minimum so that the scheme remains viable to provide all items needed to care for your stoma There was overwhelming support of our motto to, "Only order what you need and use what you order" The Stoma Appliance Scheme is designed to give Ostomates access to all products they need to care for their stoma You will be pleased to know that the majority of our boxes have been used: we have established a relationship with St John of God and Royal Perth Hospital to recycle their boxes and packing material We regularly advertise the boxes accumulated from our deliveries that are too big to use for parcel postage on Facebook, Marketplace and Gumtree for a small donation We only carry a small back-up supply of purchased boxes in case we are running low, as we can't afford to not send your supplies
Tips and tricks to increase wear time	 Keep in mind that 'longer' is not always 'better'. Skin health and other factors need to be taken into consideration, and how long a bag serves you well is very individual Action by WAOA - Work on an article on how Ostomates might increase their wear time if possible
Some members asked for more education	 Continue to run information sessions on various topics and have them available on our website for you to explore at your convenience
Some members asked for a low cost range of products	Uncertain at this point
Some members asked for a home visit from our STN	 This service is already available if no other option is available to the Ostomate. Please contact us to discuss

Other WAOA General Feedback

- Thank you for your general suggestions and very nice comments and compliments. They are very much appreciated
- We apologise to have not enabled the survey to account for Ostomates with 2 stomas: this was an oversight on our behalf
- We DO carry Hidden Disability lanyards: they are available on request for a donation
- We regularly send products that have been returned to WAOA to countries where Ostomates are less fortunate and don't have easy access to products
- Please return any products you no longer need for any reason to us and we will make sure they go to a good cause (includes use for education)
- Our STN is available to all members by appointment only, unless it is an emergency and we can fit you in
- We have recently done a makeover of the front area in an attempt to make it more pleasant
- We have one ACROD parking spot right in front of the building and would ask you only make use of this if you are eligible. There is 2 hour free street parking and the WAOA car park at the back of the building available for you
- We keep a 'credit account' for postage and fee funds on your record. You are welcome to make contributions towards your fees throughout the year to avoid a lump sum
- We are always looking for grants and have successfully applied for a number of them

In Conclusion –

We agree that a having a stoma is not ideal, however for some Ostomates it is a definite advantage, improving their quality of life, getting *them away from the toilet*. Others might have faced even more serious consequences due to cancer, malformations or trauma.

We are working through members who indicated they wished to be contacted for specific reasons.
